3. Opening of the meeting by the host president, Warren Wilson

The meeting was opened at 8.40 am. Warren Wilson welcomed all delegates.

4. Past President's Report by Bruce Schuster

The year has come and gone so fast, it seems to be the lifestyle we live with. I appreciate the opportunity of being President of the ANBC for the past year.

With the signing of the sponsorship Agreement with Golden Cob for the ensuing years, it is comforting to know that we have a continuing sponsor who has been involved with the ANBC for many years. To the other sponsors Chapman Rings (Pet Care Direct), BRASEA, and various Specialty Clubs I thank you for your monetary support.

To Bob Bourke and his team who put together the new Standard, I feel you have achieved a first class Budgerigar Standard that exhibitors, judges and breeders will put to good use and enjoy.

In the day of emails, I thank Alistair Home for keeping me abreast of the events in which he was involved. Living in Cairns, one is distanced but with rechnology one can keep in touch. Alistair has been involved with the World Budgerigar Organisation, Importation, past Secretary Bruce Bradford and Warren Wilson with the forthcoming national Show in Coff's Harbour.

I thank Warren Wilson and all his team for organising the National Show and his involvement within the fancy. All Zones have their workers and I would like to see them encourage others to be involved so the Budgerigar Fancy can grow through the breeding of birds and friendship.

Once again I appreciate the honour of being President for the past year and wish everyone good health and success for the future.

5. Election of President:

Motion by Derek Poole, Seconded by Rob Hugo: *That Warren Wilson be elected Council President 2004/05:* -carried unanimously

6. Election of Secretary:

Motion by Bruce Bradford, Seconded by Bruce Schuster: *that Mr Alistair Home be elected as Secretary of the ANBC for the 2004-2005 term* -carried unanimously

Moved: NSW

7. Time for meeting

Morning tea break at 10 am and Lunch at 12.30 pm.

8. Minutes of previous meeting

Motion by Bruce Schuster, Seconded by Rob Hugo: *that the minutes of the previous meeting as attached be accepted.*

It was drawn to Council's attention that the minutes did not record the endorsement of the 2003 Colour and Standards Report. The C&S Coordinator had prepared and implemented a task list based on that report. Council agreed that the 2003 C&S report should be confirmed and that the task list be endorsed and that this be incorporated into the motion. The amended motion was carried unanimously.

9. Matters arising:

- a) Sponsorship – the Secretary reported that he understood that Golden Cob may be willing to provide a trophy to be presented to the winning State or Zone each year in addition to inscription on the Perpetual Trophy. Leigh Downey moved and Peter Glassenbury seconded *that Council accept this offer.* Carried unanimously.
- b) Web site – to be considered in general business
- c) Team transport –Secretary reported that there seemed little benefit in opening accounts with freight carriers since transport of birds as extra passenger luggage still provides the simplest, most efficient system.
- d) Standard – sale of prints etc
- e) Inserts in show cages

It was moved by Dave Ganzer and seconded Bruce Schuster: *That the plastic insert "cage savers" that have been trialed for the past 12 months be approved for use with the ANBC cage.* The motion was amended with the insertion of the word "optional" before the word "plastic". The amended motion:

That the optional plastic insert "cage savers" that have been trialed for the past 12 months be approved for use with the ANBC cage was carried unanimously.

f) BCSA presented a submission concerning a possible standard award to be presented to the exhibitors of winning birds at the ANBC Championship Show and NSW presented an alternative design. After considerable discussion and careful examination of the alternatives the following motion was moved by Peter Glassenbury and seconded by Bill Sedgwick:

That Council provisionally adopt the larger form of the trophy tabled by South Australia. A prototype of the trophy is to be produced in cooperation with representatives from Victoria. South Australia and Victoria will report to Council and provide photographs of the trophy if possible. Council delegates will vote by email to confirm the adoption of the trophy. This process is to be complete within 60 days (that is, by July 23, 2004). Council is to meet costs of the production of the prototype. Carried unanimously

It was further agreed *that if the trophy is adopted Council should purchase sufficient trophies to meet the needs of the full cycle of hosts – that is for the next seven years. These trophies are to be provided to host States or Zones at no cost. Hosts will be responsible for inscription on the trophies.*

It was moved by John Mulley, seconded by Leigh Downey that three years prior to the end of the seven year cycle (that is at the Council meeting to be held in Tasmania in 2009) Council investigate the production of a new trophy. Carried unanimously.

It was further resolved that NSW host the ANBC Show in 2011 and Victoria in 2012.

g) Founding Fathers – were invited to the Presentation Dinner. The Secretary reported that a small presentation had been purchased for the occasion. It was moved by Peter Glassenbury and seconded by Leigh Downey that the presentation be endorsed and that similar mementoes be prepared for those Founders who were unable to attend. These are to be forwarded to the State or Zone Secretaries for presentation at some suitable local occasion. Carried unanimously.

h) Hall of Fame – guidelines and update. Peter Glassenbury reported on the introduction of the Hall of Fame. The following guidelines were adopted:

Hall of Fame

The award is established to recognise the efforts of specific breeders in promoting the fancy at the highest exhibition level and to acknowledge that effort and achievement. Inclusion in the Breeders' Hall of Fame is based on the combined results in winning any class that qualified for state or zone points since 1983 inclusive. (Note:- this does not include exhibition classes). The following are the criteria for inclusion in the Breeders' Hall of Fame:

- 1. An exhibitor (or partnership) winning classes on seven (7) occasions or*
- 2. An exhibitor (or partnership) winning the same class on four (4) occasions.*

These results are collated by the Secretary on an ongoing basis.

(Copies of the full records have been provided to State delegates to check for errors or omissions.)

The following exhibitors were elevated to the Hall of Fame in 2004:

- 1. H George (23 wins)*
- 2. I Hanington (13 wins including 7 wins in the Fallow class)*
- 3. K Kakoschke (11 wins)*
- 4. Sheppard and Flanagan (9 wins)*
- 5. J Tanner (dec) (8 wins)*
- 6. A Rowe (8 wins)*
- 7. A&C Druery (8 wins)*

Council expressed its appreciation of the work done by Ron Hunt, Peter Glassenbury and Alistair Home in establishing the Hall of Fame.

i) Golden Cob Sponsorship – agreement has been negotiated. Appendix 2
j) Ring levy report was received from Chapman Rings. It was noted that the increased levy has made it possible to maintain the current level of support provided to each host body. \$7000 will be allocated to Victoria and forwarded as soon as possible.

k) Incorporation – Council approved the continued appointment of Dave Butters as Public Officer.

l) Code of Practice – the Code of Practice has been widely adopted. The ABA is considering amendments to the code. Bruce Bradford will keep Council informed of developments.

m) National magazine. The National magazine has not been developed to production stage as yet.

10. Correspondence

The correspondence as advised was noted. It was recognised that the extent of email correspondence makes itemised listing impractical. Correspondence was made available for inspection by Council.

WBO

The ANBC's membership cost was met by Golden Cob. Renewal (approx \$380) is now due.

Australia voted in the WBO Presidential ballot for Roger Carr on the basis of advice from members as follows:

For Roger Carr – BCT, BSNSW, SQBBA and BCV

For Marcel Buehler – BCSA

Two members abstained.

Advice has been received that Roger Carr was elected:

Total permissible vote from the 24 affiliated societies is 62 votes.

Mr R Carr received 32 votes from 11 societies.

Mr M Buehler received 16 votes from 8 societies.

Ballot forms from 4 societies with 12 votes were not received by the closing date of 28 March.

One society with 2 votes abstained.

Biosecurity Australia

The following advice has been received concerning the Import Risk Assessment for Psittacine imports:

We are continuing to progress with the psittacine IRA, and are hoping to finalise and release the draft IRA report as soon as possible. However, there are other tasks which are being afforded a higher priority at the moment, and are unfortunately taking the majority of our resources.

Before finalisation of the IRA, the process will be as follows:

Step 1: Draft IRA report released

Step 2: Stakeholders have 60 days in which to provide comment on the draft report

Step 3: Biosecurity Australia reviews comments received and makes any necessary amendments to the IRA report. The time taken for this step depends to some extent on the number, and the nature of the comments received.

Step 4: Biosecurity Australia releases the final IRA report

Step 5: Stakeholders have 30 days in which to appeal against the report.

Appeals are to be based on the fact that there has been a substantial deviation from the process or that a significant body of scientific information has been overlooked

Step 6a: If no appeals, policy is finalised

Step 6b: If there are appeal(s), an Import Risk Analysis Appeal Panel formed to hear the appeals within 45 days

Step 7: If appeal upheld, IRA referred back to BA. Otherwise, appellants are notified and the report is finalised

On this basis, I think anybody already forming syndicates and making firm plans is being particularly premature.

The "administrative process" you refer to is, I expect, related to the method for determining who has access to quarantine facilities etc. If this is correct, then it is a matter for AQIS to determine, in light of the outcome of the IRA, and is not directly a part of the IRA being undertaken by Biosecurity Australia. AQIS will not be in a position to comment on any possible administrative process, until such time as the IRA is complete, because until then they will not know what quarantine conditions they will have to administer.

11. Financial statement

Balance sheet (as provided to the auditor) attached

Motion by Rob Hugo, seconded by John Mulley: *that the audited balance sheet as presented be accepted.* Carried unanimously.

12. Membership fee

Motion by Secretary : *that the membership fee for 2004/05 be \$300 Resolved.*

13. Constitutional amendments

All of the following motions were seconded by Leigh downey on behalf of the BCV Inc

Motion from B.S.N.S.W. (Inc) that: *Section 3(d) of the A.N.B.C. Constitution be amended by deleting “and any other person appointed by the Committee” and inserting “ and at least one of the following as determined annually by Council: Immediate Past president, Co-ordinator Colour and Standards, National Judges Co-ordinator or Official Historian”.*

Motion from B.S.N.S.W. (Inc) that: *Section 4(a) of the A.N.B.C. Constitution be amended by deleting “and shall hold office until the day before the next meeting” and inserting “and shall hold office from the 1st of July of that year until the 30th of June the following year”.*

Motion from B.S.N.S.W. (Inc) that: *Section 4(c) of the A.N.B.C. Constitution be amended by deleting “where the President had been elected” and inserting “of the President who was elected at the last Annual Meeting”.*

1. :

Motion from B.S.N.S.W. (Inc) that: *the amendments to section 4(a) and 4(c) of the A.N.B.C. Constitution take effect from the 1st of July 2004 so that the President holding the position on that date will remain in office until the 30th of June 2005.*

Motion from B.S.N.S.W. (Inc) that: *Section 5(a) of the A.N.B.C. Constitution be amended by deleting “1st of June” and inserting “1st of July”.*

The motions were carried unanimously. Amended copies of the Constitution will be forwarded to State or Zone Secretaries.

Warren Wilson advised that he will resign his Presidency from June 30, 2004. *Leigh Downey was nominated by Margaret Bridgeman and seconded by Bob Bourke as president from July 1st 2004 to June 30 2005.* Carried unanimously

14. Standards

The colour and Standards Committee report was presented by the Colour and Standards Coordinator. It was noted that Scott Erickson is now representing North Queensland on this committee.

The report included proposed procedures for management of the amendment of the Standard.

It was moved Peter Glassenbury, seconded Bill Sedgwick *that the Protocol as presented be adopted* . Carried unanimously. The Protocol is attached as Appendix 1.

It was moved Scott Erickson, seconded Dave Ganzer *that the report be received*. Carried unanimously.

It was moved by Leigh Downey, seconded Peter Glassenbury *that the Colour and Standards Committee recommendation concerning the exclusion of the Opaline form of the Spangle from the Spangle section not be accepted and that further consideration of the matter be deferred to the next meeting of Council*. Carried 5-2

The production of signed prints of the new Pictorial as a fund raising initiative has proved highly successful. The auction among members present at the Presentation Dinner raised \$2800. It was agreed that Prints 4-10 be retained and that Numbers 11-20 be offered for sale at \$150 and Numbers 21-50 be offered at \$100 each. Orders are to be made through the National Secretary.

The report is attached as Appendix 3.

15. Judges Panel

The Judges Panel report was presented by the Judges Coordinator. Council welcomed the nomination of Russell Keane as Judges' Coordinator.

It was moved Jim Fletcher, seconded Derek Poole *that the Judges' report be received and adopted*. Carried unanimously.

Judges' report is attached as Appendix 4.

16. Historian's report and nomination of historian for 2004-5

The historian's report was tabled.

Moved Bob Bourke, seconded Bruce Schuster *that Ron Hunt be appointed historian for 2004-5*. Carried unanimously.

Historian's report is attached as Appendix 5.

17. Report from host on the 2004 Championship Show

NSW reported on the conduct of the show. Council offered its congratulations on a marvellous bird show – excellent and well run.

NSW identified as a major problem the management of time for ANBC functions such as meetings of sub committees and the Judges' test. It was resolved *that the ANBC Secretary should ensure that Victoria receives detailed advice concerning council needs well in advance of the show*.

18. General Business

Administration

Web site

Motion: *that the ANBC call for a volunteer to act as editor for the web site and to work in support of Deb Ham.*

BCT. The motion lapsed for want of a seconder.

Secretary's comment: this motion was in response to a number of complaints concerning the flow of information onto the web site. This problem has been addressed and he feels comfortable with the working relationship he has with our web officer.

Proposal by Secretary:

That discussion facilities be established on the ANBC web site to facilitate communication between members and to allow discussion of contentious issues in a controlled and orderly manner.

Pictorial

The Secretary has received a number of requests from member bodies to use the new Pictorial in their publications etc. The following quotation from one of his replies sums up the position the Secretary has taken in relation to these requests:

“In relation to your request to use the Pictorial in your Logo etc I advise that you may proceed to use the Pictorial in the manner outlined provided that the Copyright of the ANBC is acknowledged.

Access to the Pictorial will have to be a matter for the agenda of the ANBC meeting in May, but in the meantime I have taken the view that member bodies should be able to use it since it was funded from resources provided by those member bodies.”

The Secretary requested that his advice be confirmed. Resolved

It was resolved that the Secretary should arrange for the production of new badges incorporating the new pictorial in an appropriate form.

Alternate venues for the Championship Show

It has been suggested that Council investigate taking the Show to locations where the fancy is not currently represented such as Alice Springs or Darwin. The matter was discussed by Council.

Water restrictions

What effects are these having in various Zones, and what concessions have been gained for members?

NSW reported on how this matter had been approached and tabled advice from Sydney Water in relation to exemptions which apply and which recognize the special needs of bird keepers in the Sydney, Blue Mountains and the Illawarra Regions of NSW. They suggested that should member bodies find difficulties locally that they draw on the documentation that NSW is able to provide.

Australian Tax Office

Taxation of Non-Profit Organisations

(1) Income Tax

(2) G.S.T.

It was resolved that NSW should provide advice to member bodies on Tax liabilities.

Communication

Motion: *That any and all comment relating to A.N.B.C. Matters be sent to the State Executive and not to individuals*

BCV

The motion was seconded by Jim Fletcher, but after discussion the seconder withdrew. It was agreed that formal advice from the ANBC should be directed through the Secretaries of member bodies.

Other matters

There was a vote of thanks from VIC (Leigh Downey) to NSW for the manner in which they hosted the National and conducted the National Competition. He advised that the 2005 National would be a one day show and that three panels of judges would be employed made up as set out in the Show Rules.

Closure:

Warren Wilson thanked the Delegates for attending and advised that the next meeting would be held in Melbourne in May 2005 and closed the meeting at 2.30 pm

Appendix 1

Protocol for Handling Colour and Standards Matters

BACKGROUND

1. Development of this Protocol has been on going following previous decisions, which were ratified by Council. Completion was held over until the task to re-write The Standard was completed.

AIM

2. The aim of this Protocol is to outline the requirements for handling Colour and Standards matters.

STRUCTURE

3. The National Colour and Standards Committee is a Sub-committee appointed by the ANBC. It is required to report annually to Council at the Annual General Meeting (AGM).

4. Member Bodies of the ANBC nominate a delegate to the sub-committee, which is required to meet annually at the National Competition prior to reporting to Council at the AGM. The sub-committee recommends annually, to Council for ratification, a National Colour and Standards Co-ordinator to hold this position for the ensuing year.

5. In relation to Council task list matters, which are ongoing between meetings, this sub-committee reports through its Co-ordinator to Council. This reporting is through the ANBC National Secretary/Treasurer by post, fax or electronic medium in accordance with Section 12 of the ANBC Constitution.

COLOUR AND STANDARDS MATTERS

6. Colour and Standards matters may be progressed at any time by Member Bodies to the ANBC National Secretary/Treasurer. These matters will normally be referred to the National Colour and Standards sub-committee for consideration and recommendation to Council at the AGM.

7. Items for inclusion on the Agenda for the annual meeting of the Colour and Standards sub-committee may be referred to the National Colour and Standards Co-

ordinator by the Member Body Secretary or Colour and Standards Committee. These items are required no later than 31 March.

TASK LIST

8. The Colour and Standards Task List includes matters referred by Council or items contained on the ANBC agenda for the AGM which require a Colour and Standards sub-committee recommendation or report.

AMENDMENTS TO THE STANDARD

9. Amendments to the Standard may be updates or changes to existing sections or include new sections or Variety Standards.

10. **Update/Amend Existing Sections.** Following Colour and Standards Sub-committee consideration of proposed updates/amendments to existing sections of the Standard a recommendation is to be made to Council as part of the Annual Report. If the recommendation is ratified by Council the following is to occur:

- The National Colour and Standards Co-ordinator drafts Update/Amendment.
- National Secretary/Treasurer on behalf of Council endorses Update/Amendment.
- Changes are incorporated in the master copy of the Standard by the National Standards Co-ordinator.
- Amendment to the Standard is issued.

11. **New Sections.** New sections may be included in the Standard if they are ratified by Council. For example, the History of the ANBC Show and Penalty and Disqualification Clauses for the Guidance of Judges and Exhibitors were included in the Standard (2003) by direction of Council.

12. **New Variety Standards.** For New Varieties recommended for inclusion in the Standard, recommendations are to include:

- Proposed Variety Standard following the format used for varieties already contained in The Standard and including any suggested notes.
- Reasons to justify inclusion:
 - Detailed summary of breeding results including genetic information in relation to the proposed variety ie. Dominant, Recessive, Semi-dominant, Sex Linked etc.,

- Variety features which differentiate it from other Standard varieties.
- Compound Varieties included in its make up ie. Rainbow = Yellow Faced Blue Opaline Clearwing.
- Suggested placement in the Matrix with reasons and suggested groups for combinations included.
- Popularity ie. Gaining popularity with breeders and exhibitors and is being exhibited in NSV Classes in significant numbers (Detail is to be provided).
- Promotion – who is promoting the variety and with what frequency?
- Proposed date for inclusion in the Standard.
- Recommendation in relation to inclusion in the National Competition.

CONCLUSION

13. The standard has been produced in loose-leaf form to facilitate timely amendment when considered necessary by Council. In cases where a recommendation to change the classes in the National Competition will follow a recommended change to the Standard cognisance should be taken of the time restraints needed to effect the changes and provide sufficient notice to breeders, exhibitors and judges.

Dear Bruce,

I am pleased to confirm GOLDEN COB@ sponsorship by Effem Foods Pty Ltd trading as MasterFoods Australia New Zealand Petcare ("MasterFoods Petcare") of the Australian National Budgerigar Council (from here on referred to as A.N.B.C) and specifically the Australian National Championship Show for the next seven (7) years commencing 2004 to 2010 ("Event").

I have allocated a sum of \$2500.00 AUD per calendar year, to be paid to the Secretary of the ANBC in February of each year after receipt of a tax invoice increasing annually with six (6) incremental steps at \$250 each. In addition, MasterFoods Petcare will supply twenty five (25) GOLDEN COB shirts that are to be worn during the Australian National Championship Show. MasterFoods Petcare will also supply all seed used at the Australian National Championship Show free of charge for the competing state teams.

It is agreed that the sponsorship monies will be used for Australian National Championship Show related activities such as hire of venue, purchase of trophies and associated show expenses, including the cost incurred for judges.

In line with normal business practices, I expect this arrangement will be subject to review at the end of this seven (7) year term, with MasterFoods Petcare given first option of sponsorship renewal.

The following conditions apply to our offer of sponsorship:

1. **Exclusivity** - GOLDEN COB (and/or any other MasterFoods Petcare bird seed product as deemed by MasterFoods Petcare to be appropriate) will be the sole bird seed associated in any way with the EVENT. All other birdseed suppliers or other suppliers deemed by MasterFoods to be competitive suppliers of GOLDEN COB products are to be excluded from joint sponsorship and excluded from displaying any product or advertising material at the show venue.
2. **Naming Rights** - ANBC grants MasterFoods Petcare first right of refusal if naming rights in the EVENT should become available. * See appended Note 1.
3. **Report** - ANBC will provide MasterFoods Petcare with a report annually in June, which outlines any information relevant to and requested by MasterFoods Petcare including but not limited to a summary of the expenditure of the sponsorship monies in writing. ANBC will also provide a list of Clubs in each state with a contact name and phone number and the number of members to be updated by the end of May each year.
4. **Marketing** - The ANBC and MasterFoods Petcare will use its best endeavours to promote the EVENT, and work in conjunction with MasterFoods Petcare to achieve this.

5. **Advertising** –All references to the EVENT will always include GOLDEN COB in ~~the title before, during and after the EVENT and including~~ all advertising for the EVENT. The GOLDEN COB name will be featured on trophies as agreed with GOLDEN COB. GOLDEN COB branded cage stickers will be the only cage stickers used.* See appended Note 2.
6. **Display and Exhibition Space** - Each host state will be required to supply a prime position to MasterFoods Petcare to set up a display and will also provide assistance with setting up of the display over the weekend if required and requested by MasterFoods.
7. **MasterFoods Petcare Representation** - MasterFoods Petcare have the right to present awards for classes as agreed between MasterFoods Petcare and the Host Zone/State.
8. **Staffing** - ANBC will provide the staff to position all MasterFoods Petcare signage, bunting and other presence materials (which will be provided by MasterFoods Petcare) in and around the area to be used for the EVENT. ANBC will also ensure the officials and stewards wear the MasterFoods Petcare provided GOLDEN COB shirts during the EVENT.
9. **Admission** - ANBC will provide MasterFoods Petcare with a reasonable quantity of complimentary passes to the EVENT. These may be used for promotional and trade related purposes.
10. **Period of Agreement** - This agreement is for an initial term of seven (7) years (unless terminated earlier by MasterFoods Petcare) and may be extended for a

further term by agreement between the parties. MasterFoods Petcare have first right of refusal of sponsorship renewal.

11. **Release and Indemnity** - ANBC releases and indemnifies, keeps indemnified and holds MasterFoods Petcare harmless from and against any liability, action, claim, loss or demand (including legal costs on a full indemnity basis) ("Claim") for personal injury (including death) or property loss which occurs as a result of any act or omission by ANBC or any person acting on its behalf in connection with the EVENT.
12. **Insurance** - ANBC must obtain and at all times maintain public liability insurance (for an amount approved by MasterFoods Petcare with a reputable and responsible insurer approved by MasterFoods Petcare) to cover any claim arising in connection with the EVENT, and must provide evidence of that insurance to MasterFoods Petcare immediately on request.
13. **Compliance** - ANBC will comply with all legislation, regulations and required permits and licences in relation to the EVENT and its operation.
